You may be aware that under Swachh Bharat Mission, municipal solid waste management is an important component which comprises of waste segregation & storage at source, primary collection, secondary storage, transportation, resource recovery, processing and final disposal. During the recent Video Conferencing with State Mission Directors of SBM, queries have been raised regarding usage of funds available for Solid Waste Management in different modes/scenarios of project implementation.

2. It has already been explained at various occasions that Central Government's support for the municipal solid waste management projects for each city/town is available @ Rs. 240/- per capita for census 2011 population (i.e. for a city with 1 Lakh population, maximum central VGF/Grant admissible will be Rs. 2.4 crore). Similarly, the cost of DPR preparation is also available @ Rs. 12/- per capita for census 2011 population for each city/town.

4. In above context, it is further clarified that Central Government's VGF/Grant may be used towards following different scenarios for;

- ✓ integrated SWM project or even for few deficient project components
- ✓ revival of dysfunctional SWM plants,
- ✓ output based subsidy or bridging the tariff gap i.e. one notified by State Electricity Regulatory Commission and the other accepted by State Govt./ULB for the instant project based on proposal of operator up to Mission period.
- ✓ towards tipping fee, up to Mission period, in case agreement with private operator is only based on tipping fee and land on lease rent basis, and entire money for collection & transportation and/or for processing and disposal of waste is to be invested by private operator.
- ✓ VGF/grant can also be used for bringing down tariff rate for power or for reducing tipping fee in case of new projects, for which agreement is yet to be signed.
- ✓ In case of existing compost facility with poor marketing due to inferior quality of compost produced etc., the funds may also be used to upgrade the entire chain of SWM from segregation of waste at source, separate collection & transportation and processing & producing FCO compliant compost and also for promotion/market development for sale of compost.
- ✓ to change/modify the existing technology with a new and reliable one ensuring efficient functioning of waste processing.
