**Subject: E-Learning Courses - weightage of marks on its usage in the next Swachh Survekshan 2017 - Reg**

Dear Sir/Madam,

As you are aware, one of the key objectives of the Swachh Bharat Mission is to ensure its sustainability by strengthening the capacities of the stakeholders, by familiarizing them with new concepts in the field of sanitation and waste management.

2. In this regard, Ministry of Urban Development (MoUD) has launched the Swachh Bharat E-Learning Portal, wherein online courses on available best practices have been developed and uploaded to train all municipal staff in 4041 statutory towns of the country. Users can easily enrol for these courses by registering themselves using their Facebook/Yahoo/Gmail accounts on <https://swachhbharat.cloudapp.net/>.

3. While the portal was launched nearly a year ago, it has been recorded that only a limited number of cities have realised the essence of its introduction and have encourage their staff to not only register, but also complete the certificate courses. List of top performing cities on the Swachh Bharat E-Learning portal is enclosed at Annexure-I

4. In view of the above, it is decided that weightage for E-Learning courses as part of Capacity Building measures is included under 'Swachh Survekshan'. The following criteria will be used to assess the performance of the cities. The revised Swachh Survekshan Brochure, Guide Book and Self-Assessment Tool, incorporating the following changes will be shared by the MoUD.
